David Hilliard, leading Black Panther, will bring his experience of the 1960s to a new generation fighting war, racism and capitalist crisis.

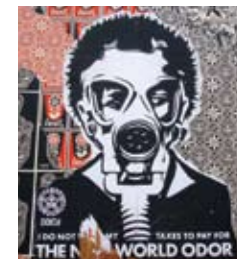
